CONFERENCE DISPLAY COMPETITIONS

All members - and their wives or partners - are invited to participate in the tool display that will be held in conjunction with Conference.

There are two new factors in the 30th Anniversary tool competitions. Firstly, no judges will be appointed - all results will be determined by members' votes. Secondly, the categories can be liberally interpreted by the members participating.

The Competition Categories for 2017 are :-

- A.** Best one Manufacturer's Display
- B** Best Single Tool.
- C.** Most Unusual Tool.
- D.** Best Collection - one type of tool (maximum of six examples)
- E.** A Tool Family.

Display limitations and requirements

- 1.** Each display must fit on a single trestle table (supplied) or the equivalent floor space.
- 2.** Display height must not exceed 2.0 meters measured from the floor.
- 3.** Displays must be constructed using materials and practices which result in a safe and structurally sound display
- 4.** Wives and partners of members may participate provided their entry consists of "Tools"
- 5.** Each member or participant is limited to one entry per category and a maximum of three entries in total.
- 6.** A separate entry form is required for each entry.
- 7.** Displays may be set up in the Conference venue between 6.00 and 7.00 pm on Friday evening the 10th of November and/or the following morning the 11th, between 7.30 and 8.30 am.
- 8.** Displays and competition tools can be packed up from 5.30 pm on Saturday the 11th.

Awards

Awards will be presented for excellence.

- 1.** Best in each of the six categories.
- 2.** Best overall display.

Judging

Judging for all entries will be determined by the most number of votes cast for each of the six Competition categories and the Best overall Display.

Suggested guidelines for consideration by members determining who they will vote for.

Presentation

Is the display interesting, well presented and attractive ?

Neatness

Is the display well arranged and the name and title appropriate?

Informative

Are the relevant names, dates, history and usage conveyed?

Rarity

How rare and/or how complete is the display?
